SPEECH BY THE PRIME MINISTER, MR. HAROLD HOLT, AT DINNER GIVEN BY THE AUSTRALIAN AMBASSADOR AT VIENTIANE

2ND APRIL, 1967

Altesses, Excellences, Mesdames, Messieurs - and that will be the end of my French for tonight! I am not obliged to continue in French, as the Australian Ambassador seems to have performed this function for me already.

It is in the spirit of the warmest friendship, of admiration for your distinguished leadership in His Majesty The King and the Prime Minister and his colleagues of the Cabinet, supported as they are so strongly by the people of Laos, that I ask you to join with me and assist an Australian Embassy and an Australian Prime Minister to honour the toast of His Majesty The King and the Prime Minister and the people of Laos. May our friendship ever deepen and increase.
