VISIT OF HER ROYAL HIGHNESS PRINCESS MARINA, DUCHESS OF KENT
Statement by the Acting Prime Minister, the Rt. Hon. John McEwen, M.P.

The Acting Prime Minister today announced the dates and itinerary which Her Royal Highness Princess Marina, Duchess of Kent, has accepted for her visit to Australia later this year. The visit will be for almost two weeks and its main purpose is for Her Royal Highness to have the opportunity of visiting the British Exhibition which will be held in Sydney from Friday, 25th September to Saturday 10th October.

Mr. McEwen added that Her Royal Highness would not be undertaking visits to all States and said that this was in accord with the Government's aim to have Royal Visits rather than Royal Tours. By associating these visits with a specific occasion, it was possible to eliminate many aspects of a formal tour.
