ECONOMIC CONSULTATIONS

Statement by the Prime Minister, the Rt. Hon. Sir Robert Menzies

The Prime Minister and senior Ministers had discussions this afternoon on the economic situation with representatives of a group of national organisations representing industry and commerce. After the meeting the Prime Minister, Sir Robert Menzies, said that this had been a further meeting in the series of discussions commenced by the Government three years ago to obtain a first-hand account of current and prospective developments in the different sectors of the economy.

Sir Robert said that these talks allowed Ministers to get the up-to-date views of those directly engaged in commerce and industry. The talks had again proved most useful for this purpose.
