Statement by the Prime Minister, the Rt. Hon. Sir Robert Menzies

The Prime Minister and a group of senior Ministers this afternoon had discussions with representatives of national organisations representing industry and commerce. After the meeting, the Prime Minister said that such meetings, which had been held regularly in recent years, did much to inform Ministers of current economic trends and prospects. Today's meeting had been most valuable from that point of view and would assist Ministers in their forthcoming Budget discussions.
