## NATIONAL ART GALLERY COMMITTEE OF INCUIRY

## Statement by the Prime Minister, Sir Robert Menzies

The Prime Minister today made a further statement about the Committee inquiring into the establishment of a National Art Gallery in Canberra whose appointment he recently announced.

He said that as promised, two senior public servants had new been deputed to assist the Committee: they were Mr. J.W. Overall, C.B.E., M.C., the National Capital Development Commissioner and Mr. A.L. Moore, Assistant Secretary, Prime Minister's Department.

The Prime Minister said the Committee had begun its investigation and was prepared to receive suggestions from persons or organisations interested in the development of a national art gallery in Canberra. In the first instance these suggestions should be made in writing to the Secretary, National Art Gallery Committee of Inquiry, Prime Minister of Department, Canberra. It was desirable that actainsions should reach the Secretary not later than the 8th of Hovember.
