Extract of Prime Minister's speech to the Sports Writers
- Association Annual Dinner, 29 July 1983.

ADDRESS BY THE PRIME MINISTER, HON. R.J. HAWKE, AC, MP, TO THE AUSTRALIAN SPORTS WRITERS ASSOCIATION ANNUAL DINNER, WENTWORTH HOTEL, SYDNEY, JULY 29, 1983

FIRST, LET ME SAY HOW PLEASED I WAS WHEN I RECEIVED THE INVITATION FROM THE AUSTRALIAN SPORTS WRITERS ASSOCIATION TO ADDRESS THIS DINNER AND PRESENT THE INAUGRAL AWARDS FOR EXCELLENCE IN SPORTS JOURNALISM.

MANY INVITATIONS COME ACROSS MY DESK EACH WEEK.

I CAN ASSURE YOU THAT WHEN YOUR REQUEST WAS FIRST RAISED EARLIER THIS YEAR, OFFERING AN OPPORTUNITY TO TALK ABOUT SPORT AND NOT POLITICS, I DIDN'T HESITATE TO ACCEPT.

AT A GATHERING LIKE THIS WITH SO MANY LEADING SPORTSMEN AND WOMEN, SPORTS ADMINISTRATORS AND SPORTS JOURNALISTS IN ATTENDANCE IT MAY APPEAR UNNECESSARY TO UNDERLINE THE IMPORTANCE OF SPORT IN OUR NATIONAL LIFE.

BUT OFTEN OUR UNDERSTANDING OF ISSUES IS RESTRICTED TO OUR OWN EXPERIENCES AND I WOULD LIKE TO SET OUT HOW THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT VIEWS THE ROLE OF SPORT.

Those who have described Australians as being obsessed with sport may well have understated the position.

No subject provokes more argument, arouses more passions and entertains more Australians.

More than 70 different national sporting bodies representing more than 4.5 million registered participants exist to administer the major sports.

ADD TO THAT FIGURE THE HUNDREDS OF THOUSANDS OF

AUSTRALIANS WHO ARE ACTIVELY INVOLVED OUTSIDE THESE

ORGANISATIONS AND YOU BEGIN TO APPRECIATE THE EXTENT

OF COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT IN SPORT.

BEYOND THOSE ACTIVELY INVOLVED ARE COUNTLESS THOUSANDS WHO ARE ACTIVELY INTERESTED - THE READERS, VIEWERS AND LISTENERS CATERED FOR BY SPORTS JOURNALISTS.

CLEARLY SPORT REACHES INTO MOST CORNERS OF AUSTRALIAN LIFE.

FOR MOST OF THE 80-ODD YEARS SINCE FEDERATION, GOVERNMENT HAS PLAYED VERY LITTLE DIRECT ROLE IN SPORTING AFFAIRS - NOTWITHSTANDING THE SERIOUS THREAT TO AUSTRALIAN-BRITISH RELATIONS THAT AROSE DURING THE "BODYLINE" SERIES.

Over the past decade; however, we have seen the growth of Government interest in, and support for, sport at Federal, State and Local Government Levels.

AND THERE ARE SOUND REASONS FOR THIS INVOLVEMENT.

MOST IMPORTANT, IS THAT TODAY WHEN MANY PEOPLE WORK
IN SEDENTARY OCCUPATIONS, ENCOURAGING AND SUPPORTING
SPORT IS A GOOD INVESTMENT IN COMMUNITY HEALTH.

THE HEALTHIER OUR SOCIETY IS THE LESS DEMAND IT MAKES ON HEALTH SERVICES.

THE AUSTRALIAN INSTITUTE OF SPORT IS THE MOST WIDELY RECOGNISED FEDERAL GOVERNMENT COMMITMENT TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF SPORT.

THROUGH ITS PROGRAMS THE INSTITUTE ASSISTS AND ENCOURAGES OUR MOST PROMISING SPORTSMEN AND WOMEN.

THE A.I.S. HAS THE SUPPORT OF BOTH PARTIES AND IS DEVELOPING INTO A WORLD-CLASS INSTITUTION.

WHAT IS TRULY REMARKABLE IS THAT IN AUSTRALIA OF ALL COUNTRIES IT TOOK SO LONG TO ESTABLISH SUCH A BODY.

IT IS NOW 10 YEARS SINCE THE PROPOSAL WAS FIRST ADVANCED - BY THE LATE FRANK STEWART, THE MINISTER RESPONSIBLE FOR SPORT IN THE WHITLAM GOVERNMENT.

THE CONCEPT WAS DEVELOPED BY A STUDY GROUP UNDER DR. ALAN COLES AND ITS REPORT WAS TABLED IN 1975.

But it was not until 1980 that the previous Government announced its intention to set up the Institute.

IT WAS OPENED ONE YEAR LATER IN EARLY 1981.

THE INSTITUTE WAS ESTABLISHED TO ADDRESS TWO PROBLEMS FACING YOUNG SPORTSMEN AND WOMEN.

ONE WAS THAT OFTEN THEY WERE FORCED TO CHOOSE

BETWEEN DEVELOPING THEIR SPORTING CAREERS AT THE

EXPENSE OF THEIR PROFESSIONAL CAREERS; THE OTHER,

THAT IN MOST SPORTS IT WAS NECESSARY TO GO OVERSEAS

TO GAIN EXPERIENCE AND FIND APPROPRIATE COMPETITION.

THE INSTITUTE NOW OFFERS TOP CLASS SPECIALISED COACHING
IN EIGHT SPORTS, A SPORTS/MEDICINE SCIENCE BACK-UP, TOP
CLASS COMPETITION OPPORTUNITIES IN AUSTRALIA AND
OVERSEAS, AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT THROUGH CANBERRA ACADEMIC
AND TECHNICAL INSTITUTIONS.

By any measure, the A.I.S. has already achieved much.

AT THE COMMONWEALTH GAMES 26 OF THE 70 GOLD MEDALS WON BY AUSTRALIANS WENT TO A.I.S. ATHLETES.

OUR NATIONAL NETBALL TEAM, WITH WHICH THE INSTITUTE IS CLOSELY INVOLVED, HAS RECENTLY WON THE WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP.

THAT MAGNIFICENT DISTANCE RUNNER ROBERT DE CASTELLA, WHO INSPIRED US ALL WITH HIS WIN IN THE BRISBANE MARATHON AND HAS NOW ESTABLISHED HIS DOMINANCE IN THIS EVENT WITH HIS BRILLIANTVICTORY IN ROTTERDAM, IS ALSO AT THE INSTITUTE.

_ Wally Masur, who with Pat Cash, Looks set to RE-ESTABLISH AUSTRALIA AS A FORCE IN MEN'S TENNIS IS YET ANOTHER A.I.S. ATHLETE.

Of course, there have been recent notable successes by non-A.I.S. teams and individuals.

AND I MUST MENTION THE WORLD CHAMPION MEN'S HOCKEY
TEAM WHICH IS CAPTAINED BY A MEMBER OF MY TEAM IN
CANBERRA, DR. RIC CHARLESWORTH, THE LABOR MEMBER FOR
PERTH.

THE INSTITUTE WILL CONTINUE TO PLAY AN IMPORTANT ROLE IN THIS GOVERNMENT'S COMMITMENT TO SPORT.

Among the issues before the Government relating to the Long-term future of the A.I.S. Are:-

- * AN INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF SPORTS
 INCLUDED IN ITS PROGRAM,
- * WHETHER MANAGEMENT OF A.I.S. FACILITIES SHOULD BE UNDER DIRECT CONTROL OF A BOARD OF MANAGEMENT OR REMAIN WITH THE, DEPARTMENT OF TERRITORIES AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT, AND
- * THE POSSIBLE DE-CENTRALISATION OF SOME SPORTS PROGRAMS, FOR EXAMPLE, HOCKEY BEING SERVICED FROM WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

WHILE THE A.I.S. IS THE MOST VISIBLE OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT'S PROGRAM OF ASSISTANCE TO SPORT, THERE ARE OTHER IMPORTANT PROJECTS.

There is the Sports Development Program which provides funds for national sporting bodies to assist in administration, coaching, international competition and special projects.

Another vital program is the development of International Standard Sports Facilities.

WE ARE ALSO COMMITTED TO THE ASSISTANCE OF DISABLED ATHLETES THROUGH THE NATIONAL COMMITTEE FOR SPORT AND RECREATION FOR THE DISABLED.

Now I would not want this audience to think that our commitment is limited only to existing and on-going programs.

AND BEFORE I OUTLINE ONE INITIATIVE THAT IS VERY CLOSE TO BECOMING A REALITY I SHOULD PAY TRIBUTE TO THE MINISTER FOR SPORT, RECREATION AND TOURISM, JOHN BROWN.

OUR GOVERNMENT IS VERY FORTUNATE IN HAVING A MAN OF JOHN'S ENERGY AND ENTHUSIASM IN THIS PORTFOLIO.

No doubt many of you will already know of John's capacities and his long-standing and deep concern about the development of sport in Australia.

THE GOVERNMENT WILL VERY SOON BE IN A POSITION TO ANNOUNCE THE DETAILS OF OUR PROPOSED AUSTRALIAN SPORT COMMISSION - AN INITIATIVE THAT OWES A GREAT DEAL TO JOHN BROWN.

THE COMMISSION WILL BE AN IMPORTANT CONTRIBUTION TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF SPORT IN AUSTRALIA AND WILL NOT MERELY SEEK TO DUPLICATE FUNCTIONS ALREADY ABLY CARRIED OUT BY OTHER BODIES.

IT WILL HAVE AS ITS MAIN TASK CO-ORDINATING
THE NATIONAL EFFORT IN SPORT AND RECREATION
AND WILL REPLACE, EVENTUALLY, THE EXISTING SPORTS
ADVISORY COUNCIL.

THE COMMISSION WILL WORK WITH ALL LEVELS OF GOVERNMENT AND WITH SPORTING AND RECREATION ORGANISATIONS.

THE NEW COMMISSION WILL BE ABLE TO RESPOND TO ISSUES THAT EMERGE IN SPORT AND RECREATION BECAUSE IT WILL BE A FLEXIBLE BODY WITH A LARGE DEGREE OF AUTONOMY.

I WOULD LIKE NOW TO TURN TO AN ISSUE THAT IS OF VERY REAL CONCERN NOT JUST TO THOSE OF YOU CLOSELY INVOLVED IN SPORT, BUT TO THE WHOLE COMMUNITY AND THAT IS THE QUESTION OF SPORTING CONTACTS WITH SOUTH AFRICA.

Before going to some of the issues in detail it is necessary to make a few preliminary points.

OUR GOVERNMENT IS FUNDAMENTALLY AND UNRESERVEDLY OPPOSED TO THE SYSTEM OF APARTHEID THAT OPERATES IN SOUTH AFRICA.

THE VERY FIRM AND CLEAR STAND OUR GOVERNMENT HAS TAKEN ATTRACTS, I BELIEVE, BI-PARTISAN SUPPORT.

IN FACT, DURING THE RECENT ELECTION CAMPAIGN ON A NUMBER OF OCCASIONS I COMMENDED THE GENERAL STANCE TAKEN BY THE PREVIOUS GOVERNMENT ON SOUTH AFRICA.

But on the question of sporting contacts with South Africa some of the actions of the previous Government Led to some confusion among sportsmen and women and sports administrators.

No doubt you will be aware that our Government is currently reviewing this whole question with a view to ending this confusion and giving Australian sports organisations and sportsmen and women clear guidelines on sporting contacts with South Africa.

THERE CAN BE NO DEBATE ABOUT THE EXISTING BAN ON
THE ENTRY OR TRANSIT THROUGH AUSTRALIA OF SOUTH
AFRICAN SPORTING TEAMS - THAT WILL REMAIN IN PLACE.

However, there are three areas now under examination which are more complex and not yet the subject of final Government decision.

INDEED, BEFORE ANY FINAL DECISIONS ARE MADE WE WILL
BE ANXIOUS TO HEAR THE VIEWS OF SPORTING ORGANISATIONS.

THESE AREAS ARE:-

- * THE ENTRY OF INDIVIDUAL SOUTH AFRICAN SPORTSMEN AND WOMEN NOT CLAIMING TO REPRESENT SOUTH AFRICA,
- * CONTACTS BETWEEN AUSTRALIAN AND SOUTH
 AFRICAN SPORTSMEN IN INTERNATIONAL
 COMPETITIONS IN THIRD COUNTRIES, AND
- * THE ENTRY TO AUSTRALIA OF SPORTSMEN AND
 WOMEN FROM THIRD COUNTRIES WHO HAVE COMPETED
 AGAINST SOUTH AFRICAN TEAMS.

Each of these issues will need full and careful consideration.

BUT WHATEVER THE DECISIONS OF OUR GOVERNMENT, THE END RESULT WILL BE A SYSTEM THAT IS CLEAR CUT AND LEAVES AUSTRALIAN SPORTING BODIES AND INDIVIDUALS IN NO DOUBT AS TO OUR POLICY.

BEFORE I LEAVE THIS SUBJECT I WOULD LIKE TO MAKE A FEW FINAL POINTS.

A RECENT DEVELOPMENT WHICH THE GOVERNMENT VIEWS
WITH REGRET IS THE EFFORT OF SOUTH AFRICAN AUTHORITIES
TO ENCOURAGE INTERNATIONAL SPORTSMEN AND WOMEN TO COME
TO THAT COUNTRY BY OFFERING LARGE FINANCIAL INDUCEMENTS.

WHILE THE GOVERNMENT REGRETS THAT MANY SPORTSMEN AND WOMEN HAVE SUCCUMBED TO THESE INDUCEMENTS IT IS ALSO AWARE THAT MANY SPORTS, INCLUDING SEVERAL AUSTRALIAN SPORTING ORGANISATIONS, HAVE REJECTED THE OPPORTUNITY TO GO TO SOUTH AFRICA.

They have done this even though competition there would have brought large financial rewards to these sporting associations.

THE GOVERNMENT BELIEVES THIS ATTITUDE DESERVES THE PRAISE AND SUPPORT OF THE AUSTRALIAN COMMUNITY.

In the end, however, it will be for sportsmen and women to examine their own consciences when it comes to playing in South Africa.

APARTHEID IS A MORAL ISSUE WHICH EFFECTS EVERY
MEMBER OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY AND
THE SITUATION REMAINS THAT THE BASIC INJUSTICES
OF THE APARTHEID SYSTEM DENIES EQUAL OPPORTUNITY
TO SPORTSMEN AND WOMEN OF DIFFERENT RACES IN
SOUTH AFRICA.

HAVING SAID ALL THAT, AUSTRALIA LOOKS TO THE DAY WHEN IT CAN COMPETE AGAINST THE BEST OF ALL SOUTH AFRICANS AND CAN PIT ITS ATHLETES AGAINST TEAMS AND INDIVIDUALS WHO HAVE BEEN SELECTED ON THE BASIS OF MERIT AND WHO HAVE HAD THE FULLEST OPPORTUNITY TO DEVELOP AND DISPLAY THAT MERIT IRRESPECTIVE OF THEIR RACE.

I WOULD NOT LIKE TO END MY REMARKS TO YOU TONIGHT WITHOUT OFFERING SOME OBSERVATIONS ON THE PRODUCT OF THE LABOURS OF THE SPORTS JOURNALISTS HERE TONIGHT.

As a politician, and therefore a keen newspaper reader, I must confess that on one or two occasions I have found the news diet much more palatable in the sporting section than on the front pages or in the editorial columns.

AND AS AN OCCASIONAL PUNTER I WOULD ALSO LIKE

TO THANK THOSE TURF ANALYSTS WHO HAVE INFREQUENTLY

PROVIDED ME WITH A WINNER.

I MUST ALSO SAY THAT THE QUALITY OF SPORTS WRITING HAS IMPROVED MARKEDLY IN RECENT YEARS AS NEWSPAPERS HAVE ADAPTED TO MEET THE CHALLENGE OF THE 'INSTANTANEOUS BROADCASTING AND THE SAME DAY REPLAY OF SPORTING EVENTS.

THERE ARE MANY EXAMPLES OF THOUGHTFUL AND ENTERTAINING WRITING AS OPPOSED TO STRICT REPORTING IN THE SPORTS PAGES OF OUR MAJOR NEWSPAPERS.

THE LAST DECADE HAS ALSO SEEN A SHARP IMPROVEMENT IN THE PRESENTATION OF SPORT ON TELEVISION.

PERHAPS IT IS BECAUSE TELEVISION IS NOW MORE

CONCERNED AS A MEDIUM WITH NEWS AND SPORT THAN

ENTERTAINMENT AS A RESULT OF THE EXPLOSION IN THE

HOME VIDEO INDUSTRY.

WHATEVER THE REASON I THINK WE ARE ALL THANKFUL
THAT THE DAYS OF THE SINGLE, FIXED CAMERA COVERAGE
OF CRICKET HAS ENDED.

Nor could we have expected ten years ago the magnificent cover of the Brisbane Commonwealth Games provided by the A.B.C.

If there is any criticism to be made of sports

JOURNALISM IT IS THAT NOT ENOUGH OF YOUR RESOURCES

SEEM TO BE DIRECTED TO REPORTING WHAT ARE CLASSIFIED

AS 'MINOR' SPORTS BUT COMMAND LARGE FOLLOWINGS

(FOR EXAMPLE, NETBALL) AND TO THE COVERAGE OF

WOMEN'S SPORT.

OVERALL, I BELIEVE AUSTRALIANS HAVE REASON TO BE PROUD NOT JUST OF OUR SPORTING ACHIEVEMENTS AND TRADITIONS BUT OF THE SPORTS JOURNALISTS WHO COVER THESE EVENTS.

AND IF OCCASIONALLY YOUR WORK RESULTS IN PUSHING THE GOVERNMENT OFF THE FRONT PAGE OR OFF THE TOP OF THE NEWS BULLETINS I WILL NOT BE TOO RESENTFUL.
