JOURNALIST: Mr Hawke, any further comments on Mr Keating?

PM: Of course not. No comments on that.

JOURNALIST: The Australian Democrats are putting forward a Bill to ban cigarette advertising in newspapers. What's your position on that?

PM: Well it will be discussed with my colleagues. I haven't got anything to say on that at this stage.

JOURNALIST: What about the outburst from the Liberal Queensland Senator on your wife's involvement in -

PM: What Liberal Senator's outburst? I'm not up with this. I don't follow the outpourings of the Conservatives in Queensland very much. I don't find it a very profitable exercise. Which particular outburst are you talking about?

JOURNALIST: The one where he was condemning your wife for taking part in electioneering.

PM: Oh was he? Well it shows how worried they are up there. The Conservatives ought to be worried in Queensland because the days of darkness are coming to an end.
